- **‘Satyamev Jayate’ is written in Devanagari script means**
- **‘Truth only Triumphs’.**
- **It is taken from Mundak Upanishad.**

3. National anthem (jan-gan-man)

Adopted on - **24 January 1950**

Written by - **Rabindranath Tagore**

Language – **Bangla**

Playing time - **52 sec**

- **First time sang in Kolkata session of Indian National congress in 22 December 1911.**
- **It originally has 5 stanzas**

Written by - **Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay**
